The Importance of Attending Mass

The importance of the Mass and Eucharist cannot be overstated. In fact, the Catechism tells us that, "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life.' 'The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.'" (CCC 1324)

As such, it is a very serious tragedy that takes place when we withhold the Eucharistic blessings from our children. For this reason, it is vital to the spiritual well-being of you and your children to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. As you know, our actions speak louder than our words. We can tell our children that it is important to attend Mass, or we can show them the way.

Please take time out of your busy schedule to worship God each week at Mass. If you do so, I believe that you will be pleasantly surprised at the results of God's grace at work in your lives.

* When these days fall on a Saturday or a Monday, the precept to attend Mass on that particular date is abrogated (removed) in the U.S.

Religious Education Policies

Attendance and Absences:

In order to ensure that the students of our Religious Education Program receive the best faith formation we can provide, we ask that parents of students who miss class call the Religious Education Office to let us know why the child has missed class. This should preferably be done as soon as possible when you know your child will be missing class, but may be done within a couple of days following the class if circumstances warrant. If no call or email is received, the absence will be assumed to be unexcused by the Religious Education Office.

Three unexcused absences will require the parents of the child to make arrangements with the Religious Education Office to avoid having their son or daughter repeat the grade. Students will be granted an excused absence for valid reasons. Some examples of *excused absences* include illness, family vacation, and family emergencies. Some examples of *unexcused absences* include sports and too much homework. The Director of Religious Education reserves the right to make decisions on whether an absence is excused or not.

If a student misses a class, there may be make-up work assigned to help keep the child from falling behind his or her peers. Please keep absences to a minimum as they create a lot of extra work for our catechists and students trying to catch up on material missed.

Cell Phones and Other Electronic Devices:

The use of electronic devices including cellular phones, video games, mp3 players, etc. are prohibited during class. Anyone caught with an electronic device may have it confiscated from them at the catechist's discretion. If this occurs, a parent may be required to pick up the device after class from the R.E. Office.

Class Times, Pick Up, and Drop Off:

All classes will begin at 6:30 PM and end at 7:45 PM. (*Please note that evenings with Mass may run a few minutes late.*) Please do not drop your child off prior to fifteen minutes before class begins. Also, all students should be picked up within ten minutes of class ending. Any student not picked up by 7:55 will be taken to the R.E. Office for pick-up.

It is our policy that students in Grades K-2 should be picked up by a parent or guardian in their classroom at the end of class. All other grades will be dismissed from their classes at 7:45 PM.

Discipline:

It is our desire to provide the best possible environment for Religious Education. Above all, we desire to teach our children to act virtuously based upon Gospel values through our witness and help.

As such, all students are expected to be respectful and cooperative during class. If a teacher deems it necessary to remove a student from the classroom for misbehavior, he or she will be sent to the Religious Education Office.

For lesser infractions, the student will be given a verbal warning. At the discretion of the Director of Religious Education, the student may be sent back to class or wait out the remaining class time in the R.E. Office. Contact to the parents will be made the second time a student is sent to the office or if the first offense is deemed serious enough to warrant it.

In cases of severe or continuing behavioral problems, the DRE reserves the right to suspend or even remove (expel) any student from the program. The following are reasons for immediate suspension or expulsion:

 Actions gravely detrimental to the moral and/or spiritual welfare of the other students.

- Willful and/or open disobedience, disrespect, profanity, or force towards any Religious Education Personnel.
- Use, sale of, distribution, or possession of any illegal drug, alcoholic beverage, or other harmful substance on or near the school premises.
- Fighting on or near the school premises.
- Misuse, stealing, or destruction of indoor school furniture or property, or outside playground equipment or property.
- Leaving the classroom or school premises without administrative permission.
- Remaining outside or in another place while classes are in session.
- The possession of a firearm, knife, or any other weapon perceived to be a threat.
- Possession of pornography of any type.
- Consistent lack of cooperation in the classroom.

Resumption of Classes for Suspended Students:

If a student is suspended, he or she will be required to turn in any missed assignments and/or make-up work prior to resuming classes. At the discretion of the DRE, a parent may also be required to attend classes with their child once the suspension is served until the DRE deems it no longer necessary. Prior to a parent attending classes with their child, they are required to take our Diocesan Safe Environment training. If the parent does not wish to go through Safe Environment training or attend class with their child, they have the following options:

- 1. They can do home study with their child, for which they will be accountable to the Religious Education Office. (Please note that this option is not available during the sacramental preparation years of second or tenth grade.)
- 2. They can take their child out of the Religious Education Program. Please note: If this option is chosen, in order to

celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation, proof of completing Religious Education Courses in the form of a written examination is required.

Diocesan Assessment Testing

In the Diocese of La Crosse, it is customary to give an assessment test to those in 4th, 8th, and 10th grade. These tests are very important as they allow us to evaluate our strengths and weaknesses so as to improve our religious education program. If you have any questions on this practice, please contact the R.E. Office.

Dress Code:

Hats and jackets may not be worn in the classroom. Bare midriffs and visible undergarments are also unacceptable attire for the Religious Education setting. Parents, please discuss this policy with your children before classes begin so that it does not become an issue the teachers have to deal with.

Food and Drink:

Students are always free to bring bottled water. It is at the catechist's discretion as to whether or not students will be allowed to chew gum, eat food, or drink other beverages inside their classroom. If such a privilege is granted, abuse may lead to it being taken away by the catechist or DRE. Students are encouraged to make sure that they dispose of any waste properly.

Homework:

The student is responsible for completing all work assigned by their teacher and turning it in on time.

Lenten Mite Boxes

Each year during Lent, the parishes in the Diocese of La Crosse take up a collection to support the Missionary Childhood Association (MCA) of the Pontifical Mission Societies. Mite boxes are given out to the students to give them a chance to

participate in caring for the poor through Lenten giving. Funds raised help to provide food to hungry children, access to education, and more. Please consider giving your child a few extra chores during this time so that they may earn some extra money to give in support of this worthwhile project. Medical Emergencies

In the case of a medical emergency, call 911 immediately. Inform the operator of your situation, building, and area where you are located.

After calling 911, please inform the DRE immediately.

Medical Non-Emergencies

If a student becomes ill or receives a minor injury, the student may be sent to the R.E. Office where there is a first aid kit, and the parents can be informed. If a student is injured, even with a minor injury, the student or catechist should write up a report of how it happened and submit it to the R.E. Office as soon as possible. All injuries must be written up and kept on file in the R.E. office.

Parent Attendance Policy

We love to see parents take an active role in the religious education of their children. However, classroom visits sometimes have the disadvantage of being a distraction for the visiting parent's child, other students, or sometimes even catechists.

As such, if a parent wishes to attend a class with their child they must first notify the R.E. Office at least two weeks in advance so that the proper arrangements can be made. All parents visiting classes will need to be trained in our Diocesan Safe Environment policies and procedures. For more information, please contact the R.E. Office.

Parking:

In order to help insure the safety of all of our students, Father has asked everyone to avoid parking on Kort Street from 6-8 PM during Faith Formation. If you are a parent and need to park for an extended period of time, we ask that you please use one of our parking lots located on the south side of the church or on the north side of the school.

By keeping the avenue between the church and school as open as possible, we are hopeful that the greater visibility will help improve safety while drop offs and pick ups are made. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

Registration:

All students must register each year. Parents of new students should submit a copy of their child's baptismal certificate if their child was <u>not</u> baptized at St. Therese Parish.

The fees listed above are for the number of children in a family currently being enrolled in the parish religious education program. Please contact the R.E. Office if you are in need of financial aid. We don't want anyone not to attend faith formation due to our fees.

Please note: The Confirmation Retreat fee is paid separately from the registration fee and is an additional charge.

Required Service Hours:

The purpose of requiring service hours prior to receiving the sacrament of Confirmation is to encourage students to live the

Christian Life. "...as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me." (Mt 25:40)

As such, a minimum of 30 hours of community service are required prior to Confirmation. Hours are tracked from the beginning of seventh grade through tenth grade. Our parish sponsors several events which help students meet this requirement. Please see the Volunteer Service Hour Form for more details. The form is available online or in the R.E. Office.

Sacramental Preparation:

Any parents of children who have not celebrated Baptism should contact the R.E. Office as soon as possible. Likewise, any parents of children who are past the second grade and have not celebrated Reconciliation or First Eucharist should also notify the R.E. Office at the time of registration in order to arrange for their child to receive these very important sacraments.

Sacraments During Faith Formation:

Father Albert will be celebrating Mass and Reconciliation with the students periodically throughout the year. Please refer to the Religious Education Schedule for details as to when these will be celebrated. On evenings with Mass, students should meet in their classrooms at 6:30 PM as usual. Masses will begin at 6:45 PM, and students will be dismissed immediately afterwards from the Church. Please note that evenings with Mass are likely to run past the normal 7:45 PM dismissal time. Reconciliation will begin at 6:30 PM and will also be held in the Church. Parents are enthusiastically invited to attend.

School Building:

Students must respect the property of Saint Therese School. Any student responsible for not following this policy will be held accountable for replacing any damaged or missing property. In the event that the student responsible cannot be determined or does not accept responsibility, the entire class in which the loss happened may be held accountable.

Snow Days:

Religious Education classes will be cancelled due to inclement weather if D.C. Everest Schools are closed for the day or dismissed early. They may also be cancelled at the discretion of the DRE for other suitable reasons. If able, we will place a notification on our parish website, email the parents, and change the R.E. Office voicemail to reflect when classes are cancelled. As always, if you are not comfortable driving your child to St. Therese due to weather conditions, you may always call the R.E. Office to let us know that your child will not be at class.

Student Envelopes:

Each student will be issued a packet of offertory envelopes. The student is encouraged to give to the Church as acknowledgment of God's gracious gifts to us, as well as to help develop a spirit of charity. The envelopes may be placed in the general collection basket at weekend Masses.

Textbooks:

As noted in the Catechetical Overview (found later in this book), we use the **FAITH AND LIFE** series for grades 1-8. These books contain excellent content for teaching the faith. Students are not allowed to write in the textbooks as these will be used year after year. There is a separate activity book that many catechists use for class which may be written in.

The students will be required to complete any lessons assigned by their teacher in the activity books. At the end of the year, the activity books remain the students to keep. However, all textbooks should be returned in good condition.

Failure to turn in a textbook <u>in good condition</u> will result in the parents of the student being billed \$12 for a replacement text. As such, I strongly encourage the students to cover their textbooks. This will enable us to save money in future years by only reordering the necessary activity books.

Traditional Catholic Prayers

Each year the students are asked to focus especially on one specific prayer to help them grow spiritually. While other prayers will also be used during the year, the list below shows which prayer, in particular, each grade will focus on. By the time the students complete the tenth grade, they will have a solid foundation of basic Catholic prayers on which to rely on throughout their entire lives. Please encourage your child to pray each day to help commit them to memory.

Catechetical Overview

Faith and Life

(Descriptions taken from the Ignatius Press Website)

The **FAITH AND LIFE** religion series has been hailed as a breakthrough in the field of religious education. It is a comprehensive Catholic program that combines beautiful classical and original artwork with a solid doctrinal and scriptural presentation in an easy-to-read and stimulating format that is being praised by teachers, students and parents everywhere.

Grade One: Our Heavenly Father

THEME:

Introduction to the Trinity, with emphasis on the life of Jesus, the plan of salvation, and the child's part in the plan. Acquaints child with Mary, angels and saints. Child learns basic prayers.

SEQUENCE:

Ch.1-8: The Old Testament, God our creator; our home in Heaven lost through original sin; the world prepares for the Savior.

Ch. 9-21: The Incarnation, life, death, & Resurrection of Jesus.

Ch. 22-28: The Holy Spirit, the Church, and Mary our mother.

AIM: To give the first grade student a basic introduction to God, the life of our Savior, and to prayer, with a special emphasis on growing to know, love, and trust God.



Grade Two: Jesus Our Life

THEME:

Preparation for the first reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion, with the law of God and salvation history as background. The lesson emphasizes God's mercy and love. Covers Commandments, Creation and Redemption.

SEQUENCE:

Ch. 1-16: God teaches us through his law; we obey through love.

Ch. 17-23: We find forgiveness of sins through Jesus' sacrifice.

Ch. 24-34: We prepare for life in Heaven by reception of Jesus in the Eucharist and our life in the Church.

AIM:

To prepare second grade students for Confession and Holy Communion, and to help them appreciate God's love for them shown in these two sacraments. There is an added emphasis on the order of the Mass and on prayer.

Grade Three: Our Life With Jesus

THEME:

God's plan of salvation, from creation to the Incarnation and Redemption to the birth of the Church at Pentecost and our life in the Church. Special emphasis on the importance of Confession, Communion and the Mass.

SEQUENCE:

Ch. 1-7: The Old Testament covenant with God.

Ch. 8-14: Obedience through love of God and his laws. In Confession we meet Jesus in his mercy.

Ch. 15-25: The life of Jesus and Jesus in the sacrifice of the Mass.

Ch. 26-30: Our part in the Church born of the Holy Spirit; our relationship with Mary and the Communion of Saints.

AIM:

To show the third grade students that they belong to God's chosen people and the child's family is an important part of God's family, the Church. Also, to encourage prayer and love for God's law.

Grade Four: Jesus Our Guide

THEME:

God's plan to save his people from sin (Salvation History), how we participate in that plan, and the many ways God helps us in our pilgrimage on earth to Heaven through his word, his law, and his Church.

SEQUENCE: B.C.: Before Christ

Ch. 1-14: The fall and the first murder. The sin and suffering of mankind. God chooses his people and their leaders.

A.D. In the Year of Our Lord

Ch. 15-30: History changes when Jesus the King comes. Through grace, especially in the sacraments, we receive the strength to do good.

AIM:

To help fourth grade students understand their purpose and goal in life, and to see God's plan in history and society to lead us all to Heaven, our true, eternal home.

Grade Five: Credo: I Believe

THEME:

A thorough study of the articles of the Creed as the basic belief of our Catholic faith, with a special emphasis on careful understanding of definitions through the words of the Gospels, and the prophets, and the prayers of the Church.

SEQUENCE:

Unit 1: God the Father of All. The Old Testament and mankind's participation in and loss of God's life.

Unit 2: God the Son, the Redeemer. The fulfillment of God's plan in Christ, God and Man.

Unit 3: God, the Holy Spirit, the Sanctifier. Our call to holiness and witness in the Church.

AIM:

To help fifth grade students acquire a solid and specific knowledge of God and his Church through the understanding of the Creed we profess, and the distinguished truths of our faith from error that leads away from love of God.

Grade Six: Following Christ

THEME:

The blueprint for a life of love: the law of God, especially in the Ten Commandments, and the presence of Jesus in the Holy Mass. The interaction of the challenges of God's law and his gifts of grace that help us fulfill his law.

SEQUENCE:

Part 1: The Ten Commandments. Forming the conscience and increasing closeness to God.

Part 2: The Holy Mass. An emphasis on the Real Presence and Christ's sacrifice and explanation of the parts of the Mass.

Part 3: The Last Things. Death and God's judgment of us, with an emphasis on the great happiness of Heaven.

AIM:

To help the sixth grade student learn to love the law as Christ did and to cherish and love the Mass as our best prayer to God, and especially to revere and adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Grade Seven: The Life of Grace

THEME:

Grace as our link with God, his gift to us to bring us to Himself and his eternal life, with an emphasis on transmission of grace through the seven sacraments and on God's loving gifts of revelation, of himself through the prophets, the Incarnation, and the Church. The role of grace in developing the virtues.

SEQUENCE:

Part 1: God Reveals Himself. The revelation of God through creation, the prophets, and to the chosen people.

Part 2: God becomes Man. Jesus, true God and true Man, Priest and Sacrifice.

Part 3: God Shares His Life. The operation of grace in our lives, in developing the virtues especially through each sacrament.

AIM:

To help the young person treasure the sacraments as indispensable to a full Christian life of love and truth. To understand how grace works in our soul and its relation to practicing the virtues and to appreciate our gifts of reason and faith.

Grades 6-8: Theology of the Body for Middle School

The *Theology of the Body for Teens Middle School* program reflects the pedagogical approach of St. John Paul II's revolutionary teaching.

The program gives sixth through eighth graders the answers to their tough questions concerning their bodies, their sexuality, and their future.

Grade Eight: Our Life in the Church

THEME:

The history of the Church--its founding by Christ, its birth in the Holy Spirit, the marks of the one, true Church, the Fathers and Doctors of the Church, the saints and the role of the religious and laity up to the present. The structure of the Church Jesus planned, the role of the Magisterium, the clergy, the religious and the laity and our own vocations.

SEQUENCE:

Part 1: The Church. Christ's plan for the Church's structure and its necessary attributes; the Church's teaching authority. The early Church: Martyrs, Fathers, Saints and Mary.

Part 2: The Christian in the World. Religious and laity, Holy Orders, Marriage, and family life; call to holiness.

Part 3: The Last Things. Death, Judgment, the end of the world.

AIM:

To help the teenager know and love the Church as Christ's Body and the Magisterium as the sure voice of Jesus, so that the young person may be strengthened through his life in the Church to face the confusion and secularism of modern-day society.

Grade Nine: You - Life, Love, & the Theology of the Body

FIRST SEMESTER THEME:

Identity. Gender. Love. Chastity. The world is a difficult place for teens, and it has become increasingly hard for parents and educators to help teens discover the truth about their bodies, their sexuality, and their unique call to love.

In an age of "selfies" and egocentrism, *You* cuts through the noise to present an authentic view of the human person. It presents young people with the extraordinary story of their creation as unrepeatable individuals. But the program doesn't stop there.

YOU: Life, Love, and the Theology of the Body introduces teens to the truth that life is not, in fact, all about them; it is about going out of themselves to be a sincere gift for others.

Grade Nine: T3 Bible Timeline

SECOND SEMESTER THEME:

Join Mark Hart in this DVD series which explores salvation history. Learn about the "big picture" of the Bible in a way that teens can relate to and understand.

Grade Ten: Chosen Confirmation Preparation

Chosen: Your Journey Toward Confirmation is a program that prepares our students both intellectually and spiritually to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and to become lifelong disciples of Christ.

All too often we see teens drift away from the Church after Confirmation. *Chosen* seeks to reverse this trend by winning over the hearts of teens at a critical time in their lives and keeping them firmly planted within the faith community of the Church.

Parents and St. Therese Parish: Partners in Religious Education

The Parents' Role in Our Partnership involves:

- Being a witness to your Catholic faith by attending weekly Mass with your family, following the precepts of the Church, performing corporal and spiritual works of mercy, and celebrating the Sacraments.
- Fostering Christian values in your home.
- Keeping current with Religious Education communications; i.e.: reading the Religious Education Handbook, Sunday bulletins, and any special letters.
- Actively participating in our program by attending parent meetings and volunteering as needed.

- Keeping your children at home if they are ill and communicating with the catechists to ensure all make-up work is completed in a timely fashion.

The Parish's Role in Our Partnership involves:

- Assisting parents in their role as the primary educators of their children.
- Supporting your household of faith by providing resources and prayer rituals to help you to share your faith with your children.
- Providing progress reports for your children when necessary and communicating promptly if concerns arise with your children.
- Monitoring your children while Religious Education Classes are in session.
- Maintaining an atmosphere of love, care, respect, and acceptance.

Student Training Declination

The Diocese of La Crosse provides Safe Environment training from the Catholic perspective to participating individuals in its programs.

The substance and focus of the training is as follows:

Kindergarten-Second Grade: Students will learn about their dignity (their incredible worth) as children of God and the respect that each person deserves as a child of God. Students will learn about safety, safe environment and the care that is to surround them, the difference between appropriate, kind actions and behavior that makes them feel safe, secure and loved, and inappropriate, harmful actions and behaviors that makes them feel uncomfortable or unsafe.

Grade Three-Five: Students will learn about the virtue of respect, which is based upon the dignity of each human person. Students will learn the importance of saying "no" to inappropriate, harmful actions, behavior and touch that makes them feel uncomfortable or unsafe. Children will be encouraged to tell immediately a trusted adult when these situations arise and will learn about the buddy system.

Grades Six-Eight: Students will learn about how each person, including themselves, must be treated with respect. Students will learn about, and seek to develop or further develop, the virtue of prudence-making good decisions. Students will learn practical tips for keeping themselves safe and will discuss defensive and assertive body language to protect themselves.

High School: Students will understand virtue, which are good moral habits, and vice, which are bad moral habits. Students will discuss the virtue of chastity and modesty; learn practical steps for protecting themselves and others from sexual abuse, including the ability to recognize warning signs and how to react to abuse and to the possible threat of abuse.
