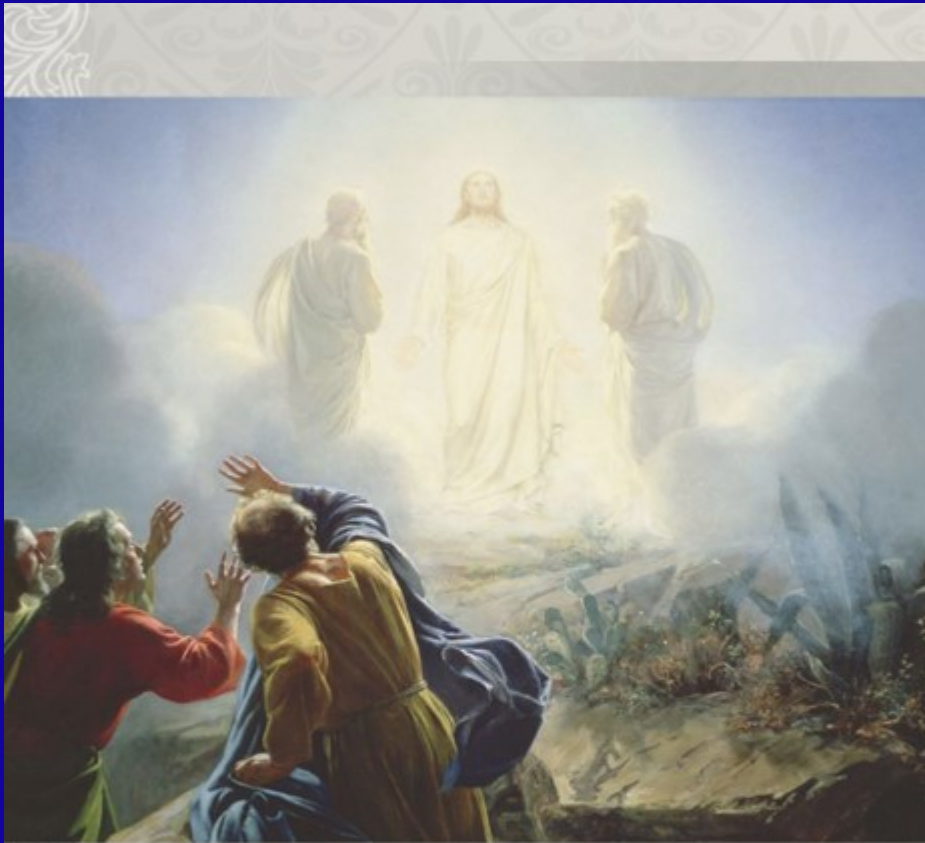

## From the Diocese

**VOTE April 1 in the Wisconsin Supreme Court Election:** Millions of dollars are being spent on the April 1 Wisconsin Supreme Court election between Waukesha County Circuit Court Judge Brad Schimel and Dane County Circuit Court Judge Susan Crawford. Though officially non-partisan, this election is widely viewed as determining the ideological balance of the State Supreme Court. It is vital that Catholics educate themselves about the candidates and exercise their right and responsibility to vote, informed by a Catholic conscience.

**U.S. Bishops' Action Alerts on Refugee Resettlement and Other Issues:** The U.S. Bishops invite the faithful to make their voices heard in defense of the Church's decades-long work of assisting the resettlement of legitimate, fully vetted refugees fleeing persecution. **CALIX: A Catholic Substance Abuse Recovery Support Group:** Calix is an association of Catholics wanting to live free of addiction to alcohol or drugs, and it is also for affected family members. It is not a substitute for AA or Al-Anon, which are strongly recommended, but it provides a Catholic perspective for these 12-step programs. "Calix" is Latin for "chalice," and it was founded in Minneapolis in 1947 by a group of five men, all recovering alcoholics, who saw their Catholic faith as a sure path to serenity without alcohol. ### How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, God often takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God is not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes, that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood. ## From Father Albert

**Dear Brothers and Sisters,**

Lent is a time to reflect on the sacrifices Christ made for us, and a chance for each of us to grow closer to Him in faith. It is not only just a time to give up something; it is also an opportunity to strengthen our relationship with God and to transform our hearts. It is a time to draw closer to Christ and to deepen our understanding of His call to discipleship. One of the most profound invitations Jesus extends to us is: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24).

Taking up our cross is to recognize that we are ready to follow Jesus with commitment and it is not always easy. Jesus did not promise His disciples a life free of suffering, but He warned them that they would face trials and challenges. Yet, He also promised to walk with them through it all, offering strength and grace. The cross is a symbol of suffering, but it is also a symbol of hope and victory. By taking up our cross, we participate in Christ's own journey of redemption, trusting that God will use our struggles and challenges to shape us and to bring us closer to Him.

During this Lenten season, let us take up our cross with courage and humility, trusting that Jesus is accompanying us and we are walking with Jesus. Our perseverance and persistence in our Lenten journey, will transform us to be more like Him (Christ like). Our baptismal commitment is to follow Jesus, to imitate His life of love, humility, and service. To follow Jesus means, we choose His path, no matter where it leads and it is a journey that requires us to put others before ourselves, to love those who are difficult to love, and to serve with compassion and grace.

Lent 2025 calls us to become stronger in our faith, not only through what we sacrifice, but through the way we open our hearts to God's love. If we stumble or fall short, let us not be disheartened, rather let us turn to Christ, who is always ready to offer forgiveness and strength. Let our Lenten resolutions be a reflection of our trust in God's power to transform us from within and let us approach our resolutions with steadfastness and determination. It is easy to get distracted or discouraged, but the beauty of this season lies in our willingness to endure, to stay focused, and to trust in God's grace. Please remember every small act of faith counts.

As a parish family, let us support one another in these days of penance and prayer. Together, let's walk this journey of faith and hope with determination, knowing that through our sacrifices and prayers, we grow ever closer to the heart of Christ.

May this season of Lent be a time of deep renewal, strengthening our faith, and deepening our commitment to living as Christ calls us to live.

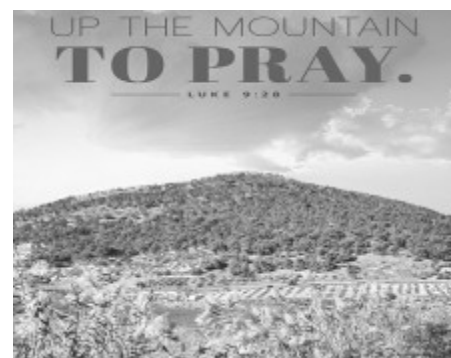


## Liturgy & Life

The gospel from the community of Luke indicates that Jesus took Peter, James and John to the mountain top to pray. Luke often speaks of prayer and indicates that Jesus spent time in prayer discerning what he is to do when he comes down from the mountain. It is during this time of prayer, that the disciples see that Jesus is transfigured before them. They come to realize that Jesus is more than a human but that he is God as well. Peter is so overcome in this moment that he wants to have tents for Moses, Elijah and Jesus. Instead, a cloud comes and they are covered in a shadow. A voice tells them that they are to listen to Jesus.

We too have mountaintop experiences. We go to a place where we can take time to discern what we are to do. Just as Jesus prayed about what he was to do and what he was committed to when he came down from the mountain, we too discern our level of commitment. He came to know that the way would be difficult as he made his way to Jerusalem. In our lives, we are confronted by how we are to follow Jesus and how we are to listen to him. It is in Scripture that we find what it means to follow Jesus. It is not easy. If you have had a chance to hike up a trail, you might find that going up is easier than coming down. When we go down we experience pain as we brace ourselves for the descent. When we reach level ground again, we should be committed to the way of Jesus Christ. As Jesus knew he would have to suffer, so we too know that our way may be filled with suffering. What is part of our salvation and redemption is that Jesus is with us at all times. We walk with him knowing that he will provide for us all we need to make our way with a sense of compassion and love.
