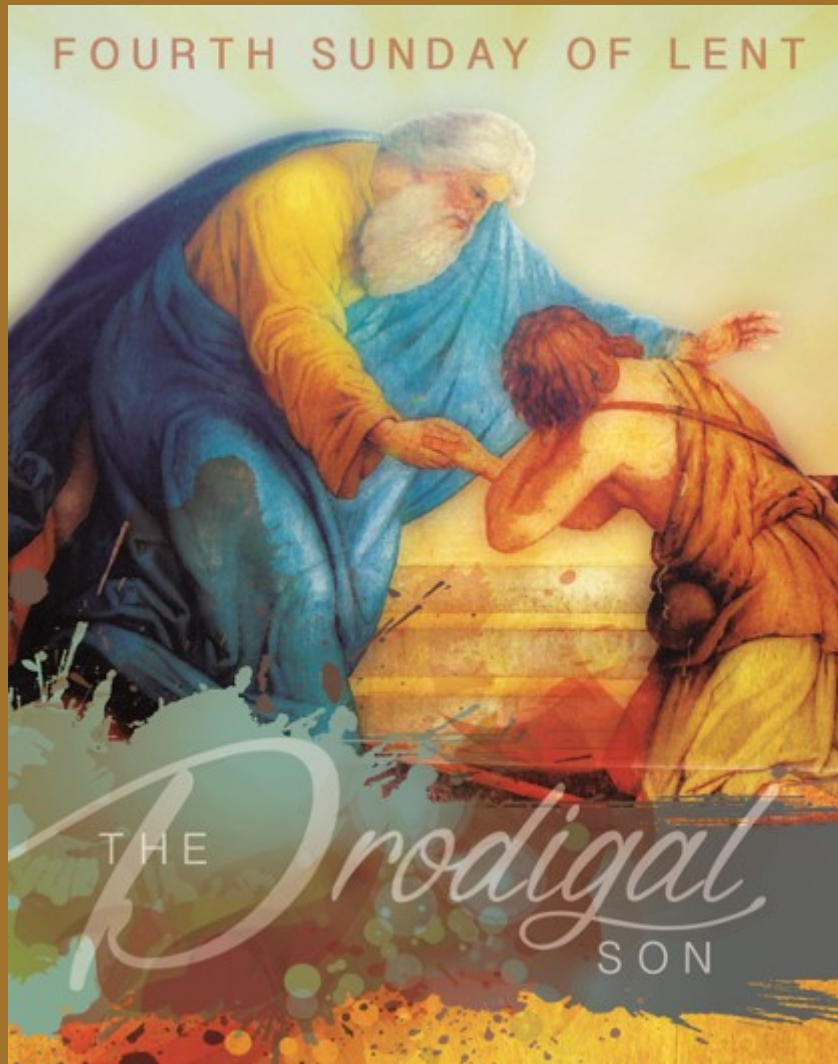

From Father Albert

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we journey through this holy season of Lent, the Gospel reading of this weekend invites us into one of the most beautiful and profound parables in the New Testament: The Parable of the Prodigal Son. It is a story of loss and redemption, sin and forgiveness, and, most importantly, the overwhelming love and compassion of a father who welcomes his son back with open arms. This parable reveals to us not only the nature of God's mercy, but also the heart of the Lenten journey itself.

The story of the Prodigal Son is not just about one man, but about all of us. Like the younger son, we can wander away from God, seeking satisfaction in things that ultimately leave us feeling empty. And like the older son, we can struggle with feelings of resentment or self-righteousness, thinking that others do not deserve the love and mercy we have received.

But the heart of the Gospel is this: God is always ready to welcome us back, no matter how far we have strayed. His love is unconditional and boundless. Lent is a time for us to reflect on our own need for reconciliation and to return to the Father, who is waiting for us with open arms.

In this season of repentance, let us examine our hearts. Are there areas of our lives where we have wandered away from God? Are we carrying burdens of guilt or shame that keep us from returning to Him? Are we willing to embrace the mercy of God, just as the prodigal son did, and allow ourselves to be reconciled with the Father?

Let us also ask ourselves if we are like the older son, harboring resentment or judgment toward others. Are we willing to share in the joy of God's mercy, even when others receive grace that we may feel they do not deserve? God's love is not a competition—it is a gift meant to be shared.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us remember that no matter how far we have fallen, we can always return to the Father. He is waiting for us with open arms, ready to forgive, heal, and restore. Let us embrace the call to repentance, and like the prodigal son, come home to the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father.

May this Lenten season be a time of renewal and reconciliation for each one of us, as we experience the depth of God's mercy and forgiveness.

Liturgy & Life

This Sunday we hear one of the most beloved parables in the Scriptures from the community of Luke. The parable is often called the Prodigal Son. It is about a son who uses his inheritance by going away to live a life that does not bring him happiness. Soon he has nothing left of his inheritance. It is at this time that a famine strikes the country. He finds himself working for a farmer where he must feed the pigs. He is so hungry that soon he wishes he could eat what the pigs were eating. He thought that surely his father's workers had enough to eat. He decides that he will go to his father acknowledging his sinfulness asking that he be treated as the workers are treated. When he approaches his father, the father runs to him and embraces him, welcoming him home. Then the father decides to have a feast in honor of the son's return. Of course, the son who has stayed home and never disobeyed the father is angry and jealous. The father tells him that he should be glad his brother has returned. There is a need for a party.

In reflecting on this parable, we might think that sometimes we turn away from a parent and lead a life that is not in keeping with the many gifts we have been given. The other reaction that we might have is that we are jealous of the love the parent has for someone else in the family. Often we hear of families where children find themselves angry because one person is treated better than another. Whatever the situation, when we read this parable, we might be tempted to overlook a very important element. The element we overlook is the wonderful love that the father expresses for his son who has returned to him. My favorite lines from the parable are, "When he was still a long way off, the father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him." He did not wait for the son to ask for forgiveness but showed his love immediately.

For me, the love of the father is the most important part of the parable. I am always reminded of God's remarkable and unconditional love. When my mother was in the nursing home, I would try to visit her daily. At one point when I came for my visit, my mother was in her chair waiting for dinner to be served. At this point she already had dementia. When she saw me, she said very distinctly, "There she is, that's my daughter." I never read this parable again, without thinking of my mother. My mother conveyed to me her unconditional love for me and for that I was grateful but also thought of the many times I might have hurt her in some way.

God's love for us is like the parent in the parable. God does not wait for us to admit our sinfulness. God simply loves us completely. This parable is one about love, a love that cannot be ignored but a love that enables us to love even if we are jealous or if we have squandered our gifts. Whatever the situation, God always loves unconditionally.
