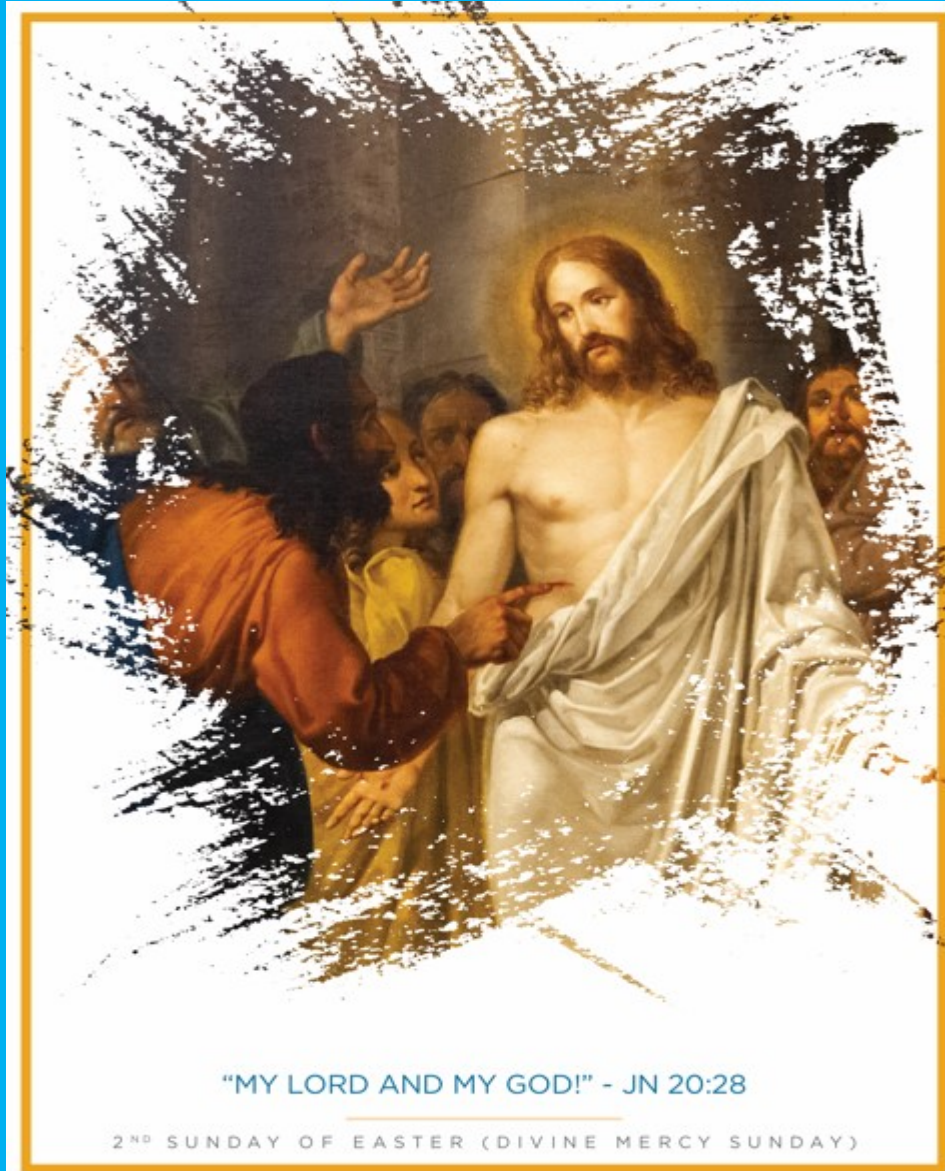

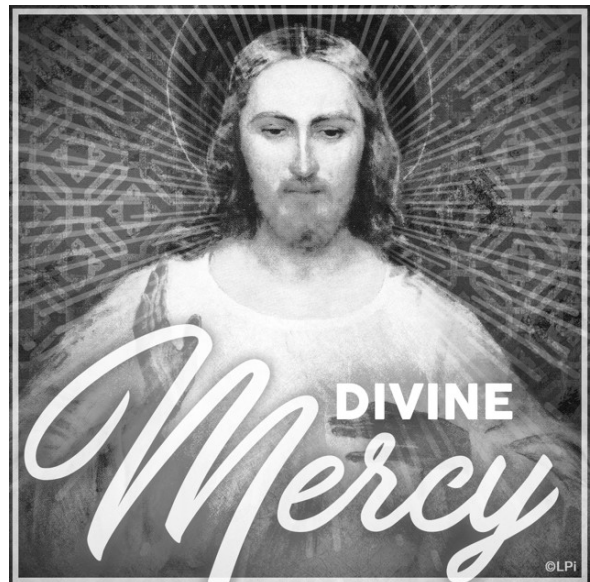

## Liturgy & Life

Since I write this reflection on Monday of the week prior to the coming Sunday's gospel, I ask that we all remember the death of Pope Francis who died on this day, April 21, 2025. May he enjoy the embrace of the Risen Christ and experience resurrection. We have been blest because of his leadership in the Church. May he rest in peace.

We will be celebrating the Easter Season through Pentecost on June 8, 2025. This Sunday we hear from the Gospel of John. The passage declares that the disciples were locked in a room because they feared the Jews. Jesus came and stood in their midst. He said to them, "Peace be with you." He knew they would wonder, so he showed them the wounds in his hands and side. He instructed them to go out and preach the good news. He breathed on them and sent his Holy Spirit.

Thomas, one of the disciples was not there when this happened. The others told him that they had seen the Risen Lord. He could not believe them and wanted his own proof. He wanted to touch the wounds of Jesus. A week later, Jesus came again and wished everyone peace. Then he invited Thomas to touch him. Thomas was convinced and said, "My Lord and my God." Jesus said to Thomas, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen, but have believed."

In reflecting on this gospel, is it possible that we too wonder and doubt the resurrection? Do we want more proof? How do we come to believe in the resurrected Christ? If we read the gospel literally, we might think that we too need to see Jesus in our midst in physical form. Yet we can believe when we recognize the Risen Lord in our midst in this year 2025. We recognize Jesus in the Sacraments we celebrate but we also recognize him in each person that we meet. The divine is in each of us. Jesus is indeed among us.

We might have doubts about the resurrection but we continue to struggle with our doubts. It is good for us to question our beliefs and in so doing we develop a deeper friendship with God through Jesus Christ. Through prayer and reflection on Scripture we will find that it becomes easier to believe in the way of Jesus. By the power of the Holy Spirit we can be witnesses to the Risen Lord. We can grow to believe that Jesus wishes peace for us. We can let go of anxieties and worries and instead be comfortable in our belief. Our belief will lead us to mercy and compassion for others always revealing the Risen Lord.
